A historian is a person who studies and writes about the past. The stone age is the name given to the earliest known period of numan culture when human beings first used tools carved out of stone. The Stone Age was almost 2.5 million years ago. It is divided into three different periods: Palaeolithic (old), Mesolithic (middle) and Neolithic (new). Stonehenge was built in the Neolithic period.

Cheddar Man (Mesolithic era) is Britain's oldest complete skeleton.

skara Brae is located off the northern coastline of mainland scotland.
