


# Term 6 Friday 18<sup>th</sup> June 2021

### **COVID RESTRICTIONS**

As we expected the Covid restrictions have not been lifted and we will continue to keep our Covid measures in place. The number of Covid cases is rising again and a number of local schools have had to close bubbles. In order to help prevent the spread of Covid at St Anne's, please continue to follow social distancing guidance at all times. Please use the one way systems around the sites. At Hewish, please do not use the ramp to leave the site, please use the back of the classrooms. Where social distancing cannot be maintained, please wear a face covering.

## YEAR 6 TRANSITION

Unfortunately, the year 6 transition days for schools in the Priory Learning Trust will look a little different this year due to Covid restrictions.
