The children loved all off the different games. Ralf, aged 5, said, "I really liked playing with my friends." Another child said, "I liked everything but I also liked dinosaurs."



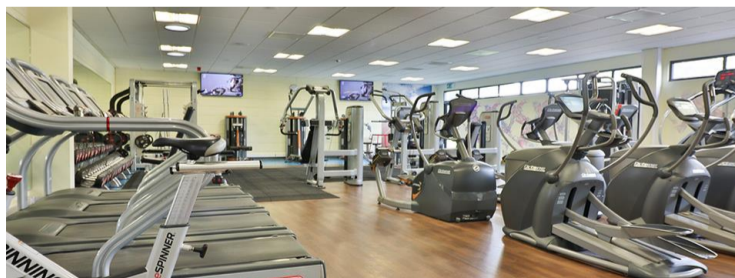
