



UPDATED COVID GUIDANCE

Here is the latest Government Covid guidance.

How to safely return to your normal routine before 10 days



If your day 5 LFD test result is positive, you can continue taking LFD tests until you receive 2 consecutive negative test results.

Children and young people with COVID-19 should not attend their education setting while they are infectious. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these tests results are negative, they should return to their educational setting if they normally attend one, as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature. They should follow the guidance for their educational setting.



This year, Red Nose Day is on **Friday 18th March**. This year we will be combining Red Nose Day with 'Wear A Hat Day' for Brain Tumour Research, which is our Trust charity of the year. To support both charities, on Friday 18th March, we will be asking everyone to wear something red (including noses, tops or comic relief accessories) for Comic Relief as well the option to wear a hat for Brain Tumour



Research. You could wear something red or spruce up your school uniform with a super snazzy or unique hat. We aim to keep it low-key this year as March has already leant itself to numerous events and occasions but class activities will also take place to share with children the importance of supporting charities, thinking of others and being generous. If you would like to make a donation, class teachers will be collecting these and the collection will be divided between both Comic Relief and Brain Tumour Research.

FRUIT SNACKS AND LUNCH BOXES

Please can we remind everyone that snacks provided for children to eat at breaktime should only be **fruit**. Fruit is provided for children in EYFS and KS1 and children in KS2 are welcome to bring in a fruit snack for breaktime. We are seeing an increase in sugary snacks being brought in as snacks and in lunchboxes. Please support us to encourage healthy snacks and meals for your children. Water bottles should only contain water not juice or squash.



We are a **nut-free school**. Snacks and lunch boxes must **not** contain anything nutty including chocolate hazelnut spreads like Nutella or peanut butter. Please consider the safety of others. Your consideration and co-operation is greatly appreciated.

POLITE REMINDER

Please remember that all children should follow our uniform policy at all times. Jewellery should not be worn including wrist bands or headbands. Only very small, discrete round studs should be worn. No hoops should be worn at all for safety reasons. Children will be reminded not to wear any unsuitable or large earrings and may be asked to remove them. Please support your child in wearing the correct school uniform at all times. Trainers should only be worn on PE days and wherever possible be black or white. Many thanks for supporting us with this.
