## CLASSES FOR 2023-2024

After holding teacher interviews last week, we are now in a position to share our teaching team for next year. Please find the list of class teachers below. We are delighted to be welcoming three new teachers: Mrs Gibson is joining our Hewish teaching crew in year 2. Mrs Hoskins and Miss Poole are joining the West Wick teaching team in Busy Bees and year 5 respectively.



You will notice that Mrs Martin is not teaching in our Busy Bees class next year. She is not leaving us but is stepping away from her teaching commitment to focus on her SENCo role as well as taking the coaching and mentoring of teachers and support staff in EYFS and KS1. She will continue to support and drive our excellent EYFS team.

Our ECT teachers (Early Career Framework teachers, previously newly qualified teachers) are entitled to 10% (1 day) of their teaching time out of class, therefore, we have two classes at West Wick with ECT teachers who have a different teacher on one day a week – this is our Busy Bees class and Year 5. We also have a number of classes where we have two teachers share the teaching.
