ATTENDANCE REMINDERS

School attendance is a priority for the government and all schools. School attendance across the country has dropped since the pandemic. A Government campaign was launched ' Moments matter , attendance counts' in January 2024 – please click on this link for more information. https://educationhub.blog.gov.uk/2024/01/03/improving-school-attendance

School attendance for all children is expected to be 96%. Children who are registered at a school but regularly fail to turn up are officially referred to as being 'persistently' or 'severely' absent. The school day is split into two sessions – one session counts as a morning or afternoon spent in school. Pupils who have missed more than 10 percent of school sessions are considered persistently absent, (Attendance under 90%) while children who have missed more than 50 percent of school sessions are referred to as severely absent. All schools are expected to work with families and carers to improve the attendance of children with a particular focus on raising the attendance of children with attendance under 90%. We do appreciate that sometimes children are too unwell to attend school. This year again, there have been some very nasty bugs and illnesses around which have spread through classes, however, authorised absences due to illness are still recorded as part of a child's overall attendance.

In September, TPLT schools introduced a new attendance strategy focused on days off rather than percentages to help support a greater understanding of how much school children were missing. This was shared with all parents and carers at the beginning of term 1. Children who miss 4 days, 7 days or 10 days or more will receive one of the standard TPLT attendance letters. Parents of children who have missed over 10 days or more may be invited to an attendance meeting to discuss barriers to attendance. Severe absence may also involve referral to the local authority attendance team and could even result in a penalty notice and/ or court proceedings. Each child's absence is reviewed on an individual basis inline with Government guidelines.

Please do not be upset if you receive an attendance letter. All schools have attendance procedures in place. Please work with us to support your child's regular attendance.

At the end of term 3, our whole school attendance was 93.96% which is below the government target of 96%. Absences are mainly due to holidays, illness and lateness. Please be mindful that if your child arrives after the register has closed, it is recorded as an unauthorised absence which could lead to a penalty notice. Hopefully, the weather will warm up soon and illnesses and bugs will lessen and the traffic issues caused by heavy rain will allow attendance and punctuality to improve across the whole school.

If you have any questions about your child's attendance, please contact the school. If you are having difficulties with your child attending regularly, please speak to your child's class teacher or Learning mentors for support.

CAR PARKS

Thank you for your patience this week during such wet weather, especially at our Hewish site where the carpark has a tendency to flood. Please continue to use the carparks considerably. Our West Wick carpark should only be used by staff and nursery parents. If you do need to use the carpark, please do not block any of our gates and please be mindful that there is a strict 5mph speed limit.

Please park very carefully at Hewish and please do not arrive for pick up earlier than necessary. If you arrive early, please fill the spaces available rather than block others. The carpark clears quickly if everyone is patient and considerate. If a member of staff asks you to move your car, please be respectful. Verbal abuse or rudeness towards staff should not have to be accepted.
